<u>Tuition</u> - 20 lessons per week, Monday to Friday (15 hours tuition time 4 x 45 minutes per day)

Lesson times are 08.45-10.15, then 10.45–12.15 (unless otherwise agreed) Test on arrival, certificate on completion.

The school is usually closed on bank holidays. Any missed lessons will be done on other days during the stay.

Class size is usually maximum 16 and minimum 10 - but this is not always possible. For example, a group of 15-19 students would be taught in one class unless the supplement is paid for an additional class (£75 per class per morning = £375 per week)

Host family accommodation, shared room (with another student from the same group), full board (packed lunch Monday to Friday and on Full day excursion days)

Single room supplement £5 per student per night Additional Nights supplement (shared room) £20 per student per night

Leaders - 1 free place for leader/teacher for every 15 students

Additional leaders to this ratio pay £19.50 per night HF single room full board, and pays activities per week (if chosen)

Supplement for B+B upgrade £24 per night – (£38 per night if additional non-free leader)

Supplement for hotel upgrade £35 per night for free leader (includes breakfast) – (£60 per night if additional non-free leader)

Activities: We can suggest a full programme - Alternatively, you can make your own programme - see attached sheet for menu of possibilities. 1:15 leaders free, additional leaders (non-free) pay the same as students. Please ask the school for sample programmes if required.

An Orientation walk of Torquay (on first day of visit) is included.

<u>Transfers</u> - Return transfer by private coach, minibus or MPVs. Students picked up by host families on arrival in Torquay, and dropped off on departure.

Please note that the number of passengers must include the number of leaders. Minimum 15 students

All transfer prices are guideline only - to be confirmed at time of request.

If groups are willing to consider scheduled transport service (eg National Express Coaches or Train), prices may be cheaper.

- 8. Food other countries vs British food what do they eat for breakfast/ recipes write a recipe for a typical local dish / typical English food cream tea/fish and chips/ potatoes/ shepherd's pie
- 9. The law ages for smoking/alcohol/getting married/ driving.....Crimes and punishments.
- 10. Festivals Christmas how do the other countries celebrate Christmas compared with Britain? Other quirky things such as the tooth fairy, superstitions number 13, black cats, walking under ladders
- 11. Literature (specifically Devon linked) Hound of the Baskervilles/ Agatha Christie...
- 12. The weather vocab to describe the weather, comparing the weather in other countries and England (comparative language), presenting a weather forecast, discussing climate change
- 13. Travelling in England the top tourist destinations and places of natural beauty
- 14. Historical figures a look at some of the most famous English people thoughout the ages
